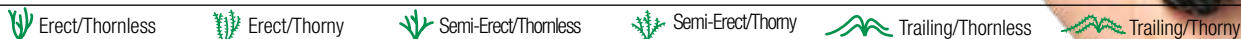

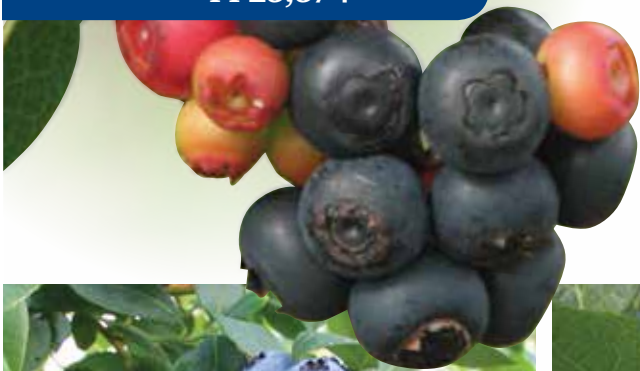

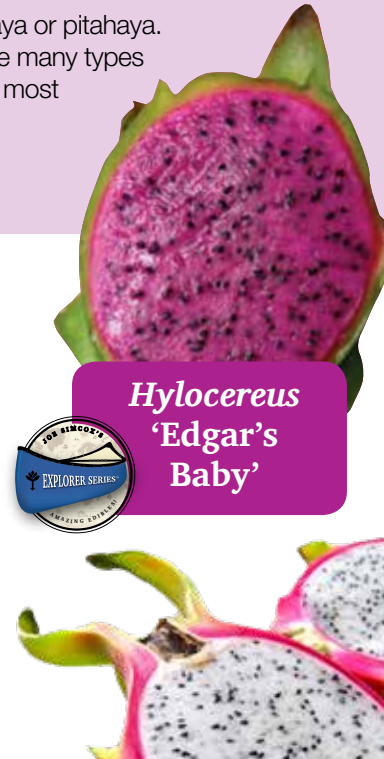


DRAGON FRUIT (PITAYA)

Chill 100 Hours

Figs make a welcome addition to home container gardens and landscapes. They can be grown as a tree or pruned and grown as a bush. They fruit on the current year's growth. This allows the plant to fruit even if it froze to the ground during winter months. If the plant is to be grown in cold climates it is recommended to be grown as a bush. These are all self-pollinating varieties that will fruit in containers. Fruit can be eaten out of hand, dried, baked, frozen and used in preserves.

Media: Good drainage, can handle minor salinity in soil and water
pH: 5.5-6.5
Fertilization: Weekly, 5-10-10 @ 200ppm
Water: Keep moist

SPATHIPHYLLUM

NASA's Clean Air Study has proven Spathiphyllums ability to remove Formaldehyde, Benzene, and Carbon Monoxide from interior air. This is an evergreen perennial from the damp tropical forest in Central America. Spath are commonly known as 'Peace Lilies'. They are best known for their hardiness, however these beautiful houseplants also perform well in shady landscapes. They require warmth and low light levels, making great 4-10" pot plants and also can be used in dish gardens and bulb pans. Spath does great submerged in water as an aquatic or with wet feet in a vase with a Betta fish!

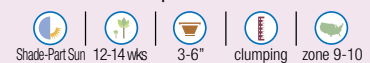

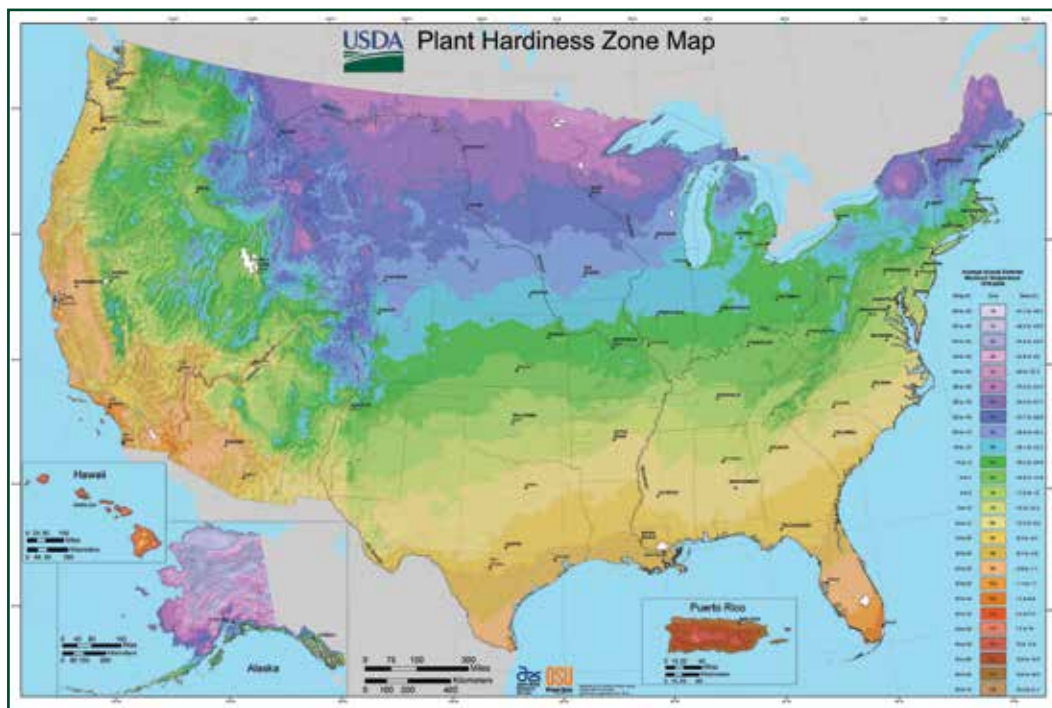

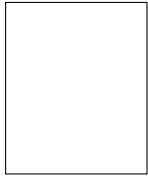
